ULLESTHORPE COURT GOLF CLUB LOCAL RULES

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULE: GENERAL PENALTY MATCH PLAY - LOSS OF HOLE; STROKE PLAY - TWO STROKES.

- 1. OUT OF BOUNDS:** is defined by the line between the course-side points at ground level of white stakes and fence posts. NO ATTEMPT MUST BE MADE TO RETRIEVE A BALL COMING TO REST BEYOND THE BOUNDARY OF THE COURSE.
- 2. PENALTY AREA - 2ND HOLE:** As an extra relief option for the penalty area, to the right of the 2nd green, adding one penalty stroke, a player may drop a ball in the dropping zone, as marked on the ground. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3.
- 3. AERATION HOLES:** If a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole in the general area, or on the putting green, relief may be taken under Rule 16.1. Interference does not exist if the aeration hole only interferes with the player's stance or, on the putting green, on the player's line of play.
- 4. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES:** Young trees identified by yellow tipped stakes are no play zones: If a player's ball lies anywhere on the course other than in a penalty area and it lies on or touches such a tree or such a tree interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f.
- 5. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS:** is defined by any area encircled by a white line.
 - a. Ground under repair includes exposed rocks in areas cut to fairway height or less.
 - b. Areas in bunkers where sand has been removed by the movement of water resulting in deep furrows through the sand are ground under repair.
 - c. Where areas of damaged ground are right next to artificially surfaced road or path or other identified obstruction they are treated as a single abnormal course condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.
 - d. Cracks in the ground in parts of the general area cut to fairway

height or less are ground under repair. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.

- But interference does not exist if the crack only interferes with the player's stance.
- e. In the general area, areas of damage caused by badgers are treated as ground under repair from which relief is allowed under Rule 16.1b. But interference does not exist if the damage only interferes with the player's stance.
- 6. ROADS AND PATHS:**
 All roads and paths on the course, even if not artificially-surfaced, are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.
 - 7. SUSPENSION OF PLAY:**
 For a dangerous situation will be signalled by one prolonged note of the klaxon, play must be stopped immediately. All other suspensions will be signalled by three short notes of the klaxon, you may complete the hole you are playing only. In either case, resumption of play will be signalled by two short notes of the klaxon. See Rule 5.7b
