Welcome to South Wales - some of our favourite local attractions

MARGAM PARK

A magnificent 850 acre Country Park only a few minutes from Aberavon Beach. An excellent day out with a wide variety of attractions to suit everybody including children (free entry).

AFAN VALLEY

An area of steep pine clad valley sides, rushing streams and marvellous views, about 5 miles from the hotel. At the heart is Afan Forest Park with numerous signposted walks along ancient footpaths, a cycle track with cycles for hire along the bed of a disused railway and the Welsh Miners Museum depicting life in the South Wales coalfields.

NATIONAL WATERFRONT MUSEUM

This newly opened landmark attraction tells the story of Wales' industrial and maritime heritage and it's role in shaping today's economy and society (free entry).

SWANSEA CITY & MARITIME QUARTER

Just over 7 miles from the hotel with a bustling Marina, exciting nightlife, an excellent market and many shops, pubs and restaurants.



THE GOWER COAST

This popular and spectacularly rugged little peninsula with award winning beaches is designated an area of outstanding natural beauty and is within one hour's drive. There are two castles, King Arthur's stone and many quaint pubs and villages.

DAN YR OGOF SHOWCAVES

Spectacular floodlit rock formations underground in Britain's longest and largest showcave complex and one of Wales' principal tourist attractions.

BIG PIT: NATIONAL COAL MUSEUM

A unique experience - a former miner takes you on a guided tour of the actual Blaenafon colliery which ceased production in 1980 and he tells you of his personal experiences (free entry).

St. FAGANS: NATIONAL HISTORY MUSEUM

A variety of authentic buildings from all parts of Wales have been re-erected in a large wooded parkland to show how people lived and worked in the past. This is a living museum and there are craft workshops, demonstrations and regular special events (free entry).

NATIONAL BOTANIC GARDEN OF WALES

A Millennium project set in 568 acres of 18th century parklands with some spectacular and innovative horticultural and conservation features in a wide range of habitats. Including the world's largest bioverse single span greenhouse.
